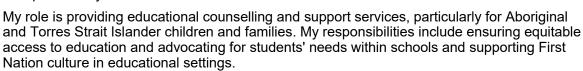


- mental health, including social/emotional wellbeing

I assist students with writing resumes, applying for documents such as tax file numbers,

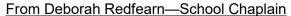
Identifying documents like birth certificates, Medicare cards, etc as well as work experience or placement.

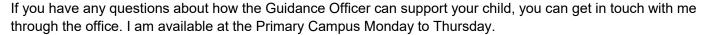




From Sarah Szery —Guidance Officer Primary

You can find me at the primary school on Monday, Wednesday and every second Friday and Tuesday & Thursday at the secondary.



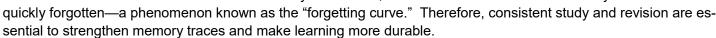


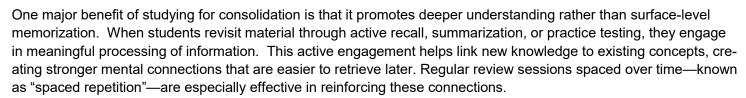
From Gil Jansen—Guidance Officer Secondary

The Importance of Studying at Home

During my high school years, my parents always asked me if I had any homework when I walked through the front door after school. My short answer was always NO. They would then say, "Well, you should go over the work you did in class today – and study that." I was not happy with their response at the time, but I must admit that my parents were right.

Studying for consolidation is a crucial step in the learning process that transforms short-term understanding into long-term knowledge. Consolidation refers to the process by which information is transferred from short-term to long-term memory, allowing learners to retain and apply what they have learned over time. Without deliberate study and review, much of the material learned initially is





Another important factor is, studying for consolidation helps build confidence and reduces anxiety during assessments. When learners feel that information is firmly stored in memory, they are more likely to perform well under pressure. Consolidation also supports critical thinking and problem-solving, as knowledge that is well-integrated can be applied flexibly to new situations.

In academic and professional settings alike, the ability to retain and recall information is fundamental to success. Students who study consistently and purposefully are better prepared to adapt their knowledge in practical or real-world contexts. Ultimately, studying for consolidation is not just about passing exams—it is about building a foundation for lifelong learning. By investing time in thoughtful review and practice, learners ensure that their efforts lead to lasting understanding and intellectual growth.

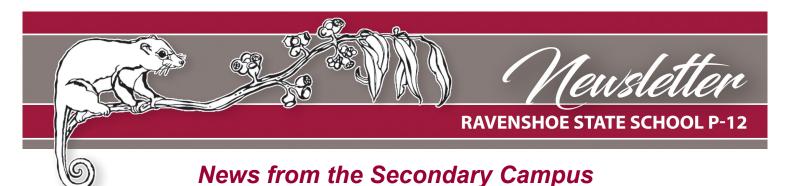












R U OK Day Celebrations

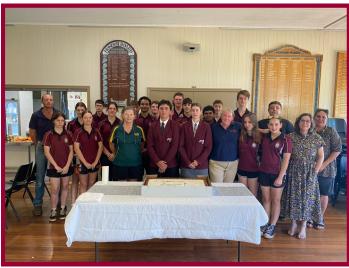




BEACON Charter Signing
